

Thank you to the volunteers, sponsors, donors and guests who helped to make this year's Auction such a huge success!!

Things looking up for a new elevator at RTCC!

We are all very excited that the date of installation for our new elevator is fast approaching!

The overall schedule for this work is:

- Installation of new cooling units for the elevator mechanical room in December 2017;
- A lockup for garbage bins will be built in the rear parking lot in December.
 This space will be converted into stroller parking after construction has ended;
- A temporary ramp constructed to provide accessibility to the library, and the wood doors to the library will be temporarily replaced with accessible doors in December 2017;
- The Saulter Street door, which is deteriorating, will be permanently replaced with a new metal door in **December 2017**;
- The current elevator will be decommissioned and removed starting at the beginning of January 2018;
- Installation of the new elevator will take place in February 2018, and;

The new elevator should be up and running around the first week of March 2018.

While the elevator will remain fully operational through to the end of 2017, the elevator will be entirely out of service from the beginning of January to the beginning of March 2018.

Once the elevator has been decommissioned, access to the third floor, second floor, and the mezzanine will only be possible using the stairs. During the work, there may be times where the front lobby is closed and the Saulter Street exit and rear stairs will be the primary entrance to the building. We will post appropriate signage redirecting users to the Saulter Street door during those times

In addition, the basement program area will be closed and used by the construction crew as a storage/ staging area for the elevator work. The Ralph Thornton Community Centre's Sunday Escape program will be suspended following the 17 December session, and other programs that usually take place in the basement will be relocated to other parts of the Centre.

We anticipate that the bulk of the work will take place from Monday to Friday, from 7 am to 3:30 pm, with much of the loud work being contained before the building opening and on Mondays and Tuesday mornings. There may be rare instances when work extends beyond 3:30 pm or noisy activities happen outside of the hours noted. We ask for your patience and understanding.

Currently, and throughout the construction, we are meeting with the contractors every two weeks, which will provide an opportunity to both receive updates on activities as well as communicate any problems or issues we, or our users, are having. The Ralph Thornton Community Centre will be posting regular updates on our website.

Upcoming Rate Increases - RTCC space rentals

Sadly, the elevator at RTCC is not the only thing going up!

The Ralph Thornton Community
Centre Board of Management has
approved amendments to the Space
Booking Policy and Procedures to
revise the fees across all user categories. The fees charged for space
rentals help support facility upgrades,
the Centre's programming, and other
activities.

While the Non-Fee Paying Category continues to offer free access for local volunteer-run organizations and local arts and cultural groups with no admission, the fee increases range from \$1/hour to \$9/hour, depending upon the room and user category, effective April 1, 2018. A similar fee increase occurred In early 2017. Even with these rate increases, RTCC space is still one of the best deals around.
